The stone-paved roads [of the Inca Empire] are often compared to those of the Roman Empire. Both were used to maintain control of diverse groups living far from the capital. But even the Romans did not have to travel routinely through tangled masses of tropical rain forest, over mountains more than 20,000 feet high, and across raging torrents of rivers hundreds of feet wide. . . . Royal couriers ran short relays at top speed, moving messages—and sometimes delicacies such as fresh fish for the emperor's table—as many as 250 miles a day.
